## Overview

Pitzer College ranks 218 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings, earning a score of 52 and an F speech climate grade. The college has a “yellow light” Spotlight rating, and it lacks commitments to the Chicago Statement and institutional neutrality.

Student opinion paints a mixed picture. Pitzer places in the top 25 for “Openness,” suggesting lively discussion among peers, yet the school ranks in the bottom 25 for both “Disruptive Conduct” and “Political Tolerance.”

Pitzer could make rapid progress by revising its speech policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating, as well as formally adopting the Chicago Statement and a statement on institutional neutrality and establishing clear consequences for disruptions that silence invited speakers.
