Overview

Colorado School of Mines ranks 86 out of 257 in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings, earning a score of 60 and a D- speech climate grade. The university still earns a “yellow light” Spotlight rating and has not adopted the Chicago Statement nor an official commitment to institutional neutrality.

Students highlight a few bright spots: Mines places 4 for “Political Tolerance” toward controversial speakers and 10 for “Disruptive Conduct,” indicating respect for others’ right to speak. These strengths, however, do not overcome policy shortcomings and generally modest results across other survey areas.

Mines could improve by revising its written speech policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating, adopting a free speech statement based on the Chicago Statement, and adopting an official commitment to institutional neutrality.
