Overview

Worcester Polytechnic Institute ranks 121 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 58. The university dropped 75 places from last year, and its speech climate is an F, while retaining a “yellow light” Spotlight rating.

Student perceptions place WPI in the top 50 for both “Self-Censorship” and “Disruptive Conduct,” suggesting that in comparison to other schools, there are relatively lower levels of self-silencing and limited support for obstructive protests. However, both areas dropped significantly from last year.

WPI could improve by revising its written speech policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating, adopting a free speech statement based on the Chicago Statement, and adopting an official commitment to institutional neutrality.

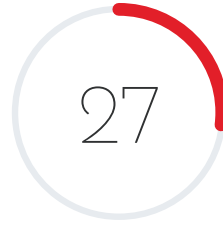
