Overview

Missouri State University ranks 123 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings. It posts a score of 58 and an F speech climate grade. The university policies still carry a “yellow light” Spotlight rating.

Student perceptions place Missouri State in the top 50 for both “Disruptive Conduct” and “Political Tolerance,” suggesting comparatively lower support for shutting down speakers and a willingness to hear viewpoints from across the political spectrum. But the campus ranks in the bottom 25 for “Openness,” indicating widespread hesitation to discuss specific controversial topics.

Missouri State could improve by revising its written speech policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating, adopting a free speech statement based on the Chicago Statement, and adopting an official commitment to institutional neutrality.
