Overview

The Ohio State University ranks 124 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 58, an F speech climate grade. The school still earns a “yellow light” Spotlight rating.

Student perceptions place OSU in the bottom 25 nationwide for “Openness,” signaling persistent reluctance to engage across controversial subjects. No area lands in the top 50, and perceptions of “Administrative Support” remain weak. While the university receives a 3-point boost for adopting the Chicago Statement, that commitment has not translated into stronger student sentiment. OSU is penalized one point for censorship of an art event in 2023.

OSU could make meaningful gains by revising its speech codes to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating. Note the institution adopted an official position of institutional neutrality after the data for this year’s College Free Speech Rankings was collected.

FIRE’s Spotlight database annually rates regulations on student expression based on the extent to which they restrict free speech.

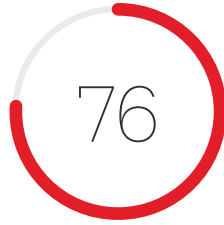
