## Overview

George Mason University ranks 26 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings. The university earned a score of 70 and a C- speech climate grade. A modest penalty followed administrators' decision to refer a graduate student's satirical essay on political violence to law enforcement, an investigation that raised free speech concerns.

Students offer a split verdict. GMU places in the top 50 for "Political Tolerance," signaling comparatively greater readiness to hear from speakers across the political spectrum, yet ranks it in the bottom 25 for "Disruptive Conduct," indicating a high acceptance of shout-downs and similar tactics. The school earns a "green light" Spotlight rating and has adopted the Chicago Statement, but gaps between strong written policies and uneven campus norms remain apparent.

GMU could make further progress by educating students on when expression crosses into unprotected conduct. Note the institution adopted an official position of institutional neutrality that FIRE was unaware of while collecting data for this year's College Free Speech Rankings.

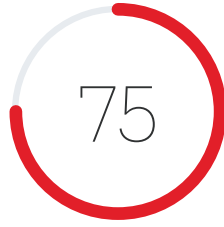


FIRE's Spotlight database annually rates regulations on student expression based on the extent to which they restrict free speech.
