Overview

Virginia Commonwealth University ranks 79 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 60, earning a D-speech climate grade. The university dropped 47 places from last year, a slide that coincided with a 2025 incident in which administrators withheld degrees from pro-Palestine protesters — an action that carried a formal rankings penalty.

Student perceptions place VCU in the bottom 25 for both “Administrative Support” and “Disruptive Conduct,” signaling distrust in how officials handle controversial events and a high tolerance for shutting down speech. The school also ranks in the bottom 50 for “Political Tolerance.” Its lone bright spot is a “green light” Spotlight rating, showing that written policies are comparatively strong but not yet matched by campus practice.

VCU could regain ground by adopting the Chicago Statement and an official commitment to institutional neutrality.
