Overview

Chapman University ranks 113 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 61 and a D- speech climate grade.

The campus ranks in the bottom 50 for “Comfort Expressing Ideas,” indicating students feel constrained when sharing views on controversial topics. The data shows no top 50 strengths.

Chapman has adopted the pro-free speech Chicago Statement but maintains a “yellow light” Spotlight rating. It should revise its student policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating and adopt an official commitment to institutional neutrality. Chapman should respond clearly and forcefully to defend free speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded. Doing so will demonstrate the university’s commitment to free speech and build community trust that the administration will defend expressive rights.
