Overview

University of Connecticut ranks 195 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 57 and an F speech climate grade.

The data shows no top 50 strengths or bottom 50 weaknesses for the campus. However, UConn's rank for "Self-Censorship" jumped 121 places from the bottom 50 last year, indicating students report comparatively less hesitation to speak.

UConn maintains a "yellow light" Spotlight rating. It should revise its student policies to earn a "green light" Spotlight rating, adopt the pro-free speech Chicago Statement, and adopt an official commitment to institutional neutrality. UConn should respond clearly and forcefully to defend free speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded. Doing so will demonstrate the university's commitment to free speech and build community trust that the administration will defend expressive rights.
