Overview

Georgetown University ranks 117 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 61 and a D- speech climate grade.

It jumped 126 places from last year into the top 25 for “Political Tolerance,” showing comparatively greater student willingness to host speakers across the ideological spectrum, but tumbled 108 places into the bottom 50 for “Disruptive Conduct,” signaling student acceptance of non-peaceful forms of protest.

Georgetown has adopted the pro-free speech Chicago Statement, but it earns a “yellow light” Spotlight rating. It should revise student policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating and adopt an official commitment to institutional neutrality. Georgetown should respond clearly and forcefully to defend free speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded.
