Overview

Johns Hopkins University ranks 114 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 61, climbing 30 places to earn a D- speech climate grade.

It lands in the bottom 25 for “Comfort Expressing Ideas,” showing students feel constrained sharing views on controversial topics. It also ranks in the bottom 50 for “Administrative Support,” indicating weak trust that officials will defend speech. The data shows no top 50 strengths.

Johns Hopkins has adopted the pro-free speech Chicago Statement and an official commitment to institutional neutrality, but retains a “yellow light” Spotlight rating. It should revise student policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating. Given its weak showing on “Administrative Support,” administrators should respond clearly and forcefully to defend free speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded.
