Overview

Princeton University ranks 176 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 58 and an F speech climate grade.

Princeton ranks in the top 25 for “Political Tolerance,” showing comparatively greater student willingness to host speakers across the ideological spectrum. Its “Comfort Expressing Ideas” rank jumped 130 places from last year into the top 50 this year, indicating students are more comfortable sharing views on controversial topics.

Princeton adopted the pro-free speech Chicago Statement but maintains a “red light” Spotlight rating. It should revise student policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating and adopt institutional neutrality. Princeton should clearly and forcefully defend free speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded. Doing so will demonstrate the university’s commitment to free speech and build community trust that the administration will defend expressive rights.
