Overview

The University of Oklahoma ranks 99 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 62 and a D- speech climate grade.

OU ranks in the top 50 for “Political Tolerance,” showing comparatively greater student willingness to host speakers across the ideological spectrum. However, it lands in the bottom 25 for “Openness,” meaning many contentious topics feel off-limits to students.

OU’s board has affirmed the pro-free speech Chicago Statement, but the university retains a “yellow light” Spotlight rating. It should revise student policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating and adopt an official commitment to institutional neutrality. OU should respond clearly and forcefully to defend speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded. Doing so will demonstrate its commitment to free expression and help build community trust that the administration will defend expressive rights.
