## Overview

Duquesne University ranks 181 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 58 and an F speech climate grade.

Duquesne is in the top 50 for “Disruptive Conduct,” showing low student acceptance of protest tactics that silence speakers. However, the university lands in the bottom 25 for “Political Tolerance,” showing limited student willingness to host controversial speakers.

Duquesne maintains a “yellow light” Spotlight rating. It should revise its student policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating, adopt the pro-free speech Chicago Statement, and adopt an official commitment to institutional neutrality. Duquesne should respond clearly and forcefully to defend free speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded. Doing so will demonstrate the university’s commitment to free expression and build community trust that the administration will defend expressive rights.
