Overview

The University of Pittsburgh ranks 205 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 56 and an F speech climate grade.

Pitt lands in the bottom 50 for “Administrative Support,” showing little student trust in officials to defend speech. However, its “Comfort Expressing Ideas” rank jumped 108 places from the bottom 25 last year, indicating students feel more comfortable sharing views on controversial topics. The data shows no top 50 strengths.

Pitt has a “yellow light” Spotlight rating. It should revise student policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating, adopt the pro-free speech Chicago Statement, and adopt an official commitment to institutional neutrality. Given its weak showing on “Administrative Support,” administrators should respond clearly and forcefully to defend free speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded.
