Overview

Texas State University ranks 259 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 48 and an F speech climate grade, falling 147 places and losing 11 points from last year.

Texas State lands in the bottom 25 for “Disruptive Conduct,” signaling student acceptance of non-peaceful forms of protest. It also tumbled 133 places after ranking in the top 25 last year for “Administrative Support,” indicating students doubt officials will defend speech. The data shows no top 50 strengths.

The campus maintains a “yellow light” Spotlight rating. It should revise student policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating, adopt the pro-free speech Chicago Statement, and adopt an official commitment to institutional neutrality. Texas State should respond clearly and forcefully to defend free speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded.
